Stranded Somewhere? Call On the Go

Have you ever been rescued by Louie or John when your wheelchair broke down? Or when your ride to an appointment failed to show up on time? Have you ever wished you could use our van under less urgent circumstances? Well... great news!

We now offer *On the Go* Transportation seven days a week between 8:30 am and 11:30 pm. We can preschedule rides up to three hours in advance.

Please note. Non- emergency rides can only be paid for with a GREEN van voucher purchased through Berkeley Paratransit. If you are not already registered with Berkeley Paratransit you will have to fill out the application. Otherwise you may pay at the time of service. Rides are \$12.00 each way.

The Peter Trier Memorial Fund

I was quite shaken by the passing of my friend Peter Trier last March. I think we all were.

I have the dubious honor of being maybe the last person to speak with him before he died. I called him that morning, as I often did, because he always helped me put things in perspective. I was shocked to learn that when his attendant arrived, just a few hours later, Peter had passed.

Peter Trier served on the board from about 1998 until 2004. At various times during that period, he served as vice president, or president. He had a rich and varied history in the Berkeley disabled community and as a Philosophy professor and lifelong teacher. He is survived by his parents William and Kathleen Trier and his brother Bill. I miss him a lot. He was a good friend.

On behalf of my friend and Easy Does It, I wish to establish the Peter Trier Memorial Fund. The purpose of the fund is to assist clients who cannot afford to pay the co-payments to use our services, or, due to an unforeseen crisis period, rack up a bill they can not pay. Clients will apply on a onetime basis to the Board Subcommittee on Utilization of Services, which will decide how to disburse available funds.

Peter was a strong supporter of Easy Does It because he wanted to help people. He did a lot to create a sense of community among disabled people. He wanted people to feel supported no matter what their need. I think this is a fitting tribute to his memory.

A Message from the President

Recently an EDI client complained that when she called to ask for an attendant, she was asked, what for?

Her position was that all EDI needed to know was that she needed an attendant and for how long; why she needed an attendant was none of our business. As someone who knows the indignity of sharing private information in order to get help, I was sympathetic. I would like to explain why we think it is a legitimate area of enquiry.

EDI's mandate under Measure E is to serve urgent and unforeseen attendant needs which can not be served by other programs, such as In-Home Support Services. Over 99% of attendant services in Berkelev are provided under these other programs. In order to fulfill our contract we must have attendants available for whatever else might arise. Given the limited resources available, EDI sometimes has to make choices

that don't please some people.

Suppose, for instance, that there is one attendant available and someone calls who needs some shopping or laundry done, then five minutes later, someone who needs help with toileting calls? Seems lousy to be the dispatcher who has to tell someone whose bladder is about to burst, sorry, you will have to wait an hour.
